Q1 Trips

Our first outing of the year looked to have been thwarted due to rough weather around Anglesey. Not to be beaten, one of our dive masters suggested a trip to Largs would be in order. A site that he had dived many times in the past and never been disappointed resulted in an early start (5am) driving to Largs.

After arriving at Largs we got the ferry across to Cumbrae (10 minute journey) and then kitted up approx 200 meters from the jetty. Sunk in a depth of around 20m-22m is a Catalina sea plane which sank when one of the hatches was left open during a choppy sea. The plane is not surviving the sea conditions very well but is well worth a dive. The lobsters and crabs which litter the aircraft are very large in places. Visibility was around 3m-4m



Our next dive was 5 minutes drive further around the coast and provided fantastic views of sea life which isn't normally associated with the slightly cooler UK waters. See the full gallery on the website at www.canarydivers.com.
